The Soldiers' Service Regulations, 1950, published in *Gazette* No. 10,085 of March 17, 1950, are hereby amended, in regulation 80, by the substitution, in paragraph (3) of that regulation, for the words "shall be by warrant," of the words "shall be by warrant issued under the hand of the Permanent Secretary."

The Army Act, No. 17 of 1949

REGULATIONS made by the Minister of Defence and External Affairs under section 155 of the Army Act, No. 17 of 1949.

REGULATIONS

1. These regulations may be cited as the Army Training (Overseas) Regulations, 1951.

*2. Subject to the approval of the Minister, the Commander of the Army may order any member of the Army to be sent for training outside Ceylon.

3. Before any member of the Army referred to in regulation 2 leaves Ceylon for training, he may be required to enter into such agreement or contract as may be stipulated by the Permanent Secretary, Ministry of Defence and External Affairs in respect of his training outside Ceylon and his service with the Army on completion of such training.

4. A member of the Army shall during his period of training outside Ceylon be entitled, in addition to the pay and allowances due to him under the Pay Code, to such overseas or other special allowances as may from time to time be authorised by the Treasury.

5. (1) A member of the Army who is being trained outside Ceylon shall for purposes of discipline and training, be under the orders of the Commanding Officer of the Training Establishment or unit in which he is being trained.

(2) A member of the Army who is proceeding for training outside Ceylon or who is returning to Ceylon after such training in a ship or aircraft belonging to His Majesty's Navy or Air Force (other than the Navy or Air Force of Ceylon) shall, for the purposes of discipline, be under the orders of the Commander of such ship or aircraft.

(3) A member of the Army who is accommodated in a Transit Camp whilst proceeding for training outside Ceylon or returning to Ceylon after such training shall, for the purposes of discipline, be under the orders of the Commander of such Transit Camp.

(4) The powers vested by paragraphs (1), (2) and (3) of this regulation in the officers mentioned in those paragraphs shall be exercised in accordance with the Army and Air Force (Annual) Act of United Kingdom and Northern Ireland for the time being in force.
